National Prayer Vigil For Life



The National Prayer Vigil for Life was held on January 21 and 22 at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, where His Holiness Karekin II celebrated Badarak on the occasion of the Centennial Remembrance of Genocide last May.

Over 20,000 pilgrims from around the nation prayed for an end to abortion before the annual March for Life. The Vigil marked the 43rd anniversary of the U.S. Supreme Court's 1973 Roe v. Wade and Doe v. Bolton decisions

legalizing abortion nationwide. Since those decisions, over 56 million abortions have been performed legally in the United States.

The principal celebrant and homilist at the Vigil Opening Mass was Cardinal Timothy Dolan of New York, Chairman of the U.S. Bishops' Committee on Pro-Life Activities. It was concelebrated by his fellow Cardinals and many of the nation's Bishops and Priests in the Basilica's Great Upper Church.

Fr. Hovsep Karapetyan was among the Orthodox guests representing our Diocese.

On April 10, the Armenian American Health Association of Greater Washington launched its 2016 season with a health fair at the St. Mary Church. The Armenian American Health Professionals provided counseling and health education on diabetes, high blood pressure, cholesterol, bone health, nutrition, age-specific cancer risks preventive its measures.

The event featured oral/dental



check-up, glucose and blood pressure screenings, as well as culturally mindful education on healthier eating habits and proportions to the Washington, DC Armenian community.

Advent Bible Study



REQUIEM SERVICE/HOKEHANKIST

Arrangements for Requiem Service, Alter Flowers and Candles should be made through the church office by Thursday at noon. In accordance with the canons of the Armenian Church, Requiem Services may not be performed on the five major feast days: Armenian Christmas, Easter, The Feast of the Transfiguration, The Feast of the Assumption of the Mother of God, and The Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross.

BAPTISMS AND CHRISMATIONS

All Baptisms must be scheduled at least three months in advance by calling the church office. According to the Armenian Church canons, a Baptism may only be performed once in a person's lifetime, provided such Baptism has been performed in a Christian Church and in the name of the Holy Trinity. At least one of the godparents must be a member of the Armenian Apostolic Orthodox Church.

WEDDINGS

Parishioners should contact the church office at least six months in advance. A couple must contact St. Mary to confirm the availability of the Pastor and sanctuary prior to making any other arrangements. All weddings must follow the Canons of the Armenian Apostolic Orthodox Church and the laws of the DISTRICT OF COLUM-BIA. In accordance with Diocesan discipline mandated by the Primate, all Sacra-The clergy are always available and can ments must be performed in the church sanctuary. The couple must meet with the ioners. If you or someone you know is ill or Pastor at least once for pre-marital prepara-hospitalized and would like to be visited, tion and counseling. Weddings cannot be performed during Great Lent or Holy Week, or on the five major feast days: Armenian Christmas, Holy Easter, The Feast of the Transfiguration, The Feast of the Assumption of the Mother of God, and The Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross.

FUNERALS

Families should make arrangements with the funeral director of their choice, who will then contact the church office to arrange the funeral service. Funerals may not be performed on religious holidays, major feast days, Saturdays after 3:00 p.m., or on Sun-
